



Schoolchildren hurt in bus crash

Seventeen people were hurt in a bus crash in Leicester on 11 December 2009. Most of the injured passengers were children, who suffered bruises, cuts and shock. The bus involved hit a railway bridge which resulted in the roof being nearly completely removed.

The accident occurred in Lancaster Road, Leicester. The school children were from Cantrell Primary School in Bulwell, Nottingham. The bus was taking the pupils to the New Walk Museum in Leicester when the crash happened.

Ten of the 17 injured passengers were treated at Leicester Royal Infirmary and fortunately no one was seriously injured.
